16th FINANCIAL REPORTING WORKSHOP CALL FOR PAPERS

New deadline: May 5, 2026

We are pleased to announce the **16th Financial Reporting Workshop**, which will be held at the **University of Verona (Italy)** on **June 18–19, 2026**.

The Workshop provides a valuable forum for **academics, researchers, and practitioners** to discuss recent developments, emerging challenges, and ongoing research projects in the field of **corporate reporting**. It aims to foster dialogue, stimulate collaboration, and promote the exchange of ideas across diverse perspectives and methodological approaches, encouraging high-quality research with both theoretical and practical implications, as well as policy implications. The Workshop welcomes contributions that employ both quantitative and qualitative methods, and supports a broad debate on the role of accounting in business.

We warmly invite the submission of **empirical, theoretical, and methodological papers** that broadly address issues related to corporate reporting, including—though not limited to—financial reporting, sustainability reporting, assurance, standard-setting, and the impact of regulation on reporting practices.

The Workshop offers two types of sessions:

- **Parallel session with discussant**, featuring papers that are sufficiently developed to benefit from detailed feedback and in-depth scholarly discussion.
- **Research forum**, dedicated to early-stage papers and research proposals. Its purpose is to stimulate constructive debate and help authors refine their research ideas, theoretical framing, and methodological design.

Workshop fee until May 15, 2026 (early registration):

Workshop fee after May 15, 2026 (late registration):

- reduced fee (PhD Student, Post Doc, Accompanying person): 180 euros + VAT (if due)
- regular fee (Assistant, Associate, and Full Professor): 250 euros + VAT (if due)

The workshop fee covers participation in the workshop sessions, the coffee breaks on June 18-19, the June 18 dinner, and the June 19 light lunch.

The **workshop venue** will be the *Silos di Ponente* and *Santa Marta* buildings in Verona, via Cantarane 24. This venue is easily reachable by public transportation from both the *Porta Nuova* and the *Porta Vescovo* train stations.



The workshop will begin on June 18 in the early afternoon and will conclude on June 19, 2025, shortly after lunch. Please note that this period is high season in Verona. We therefore recommend booking **accommodation** well in advance, taking advantage of optional free-cancellation policies if needed.
